## HONORING THEIR SACRIFICES Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

INTRODUCTION: Tomorrow we will pause as a nation to remember those who have lived and died in defense of our nation. It all began in 1863, in Columbus, Missouri. After the First World War, the day was set aside to honor the dead of all American Wars. Also, the day was extended to pay homage to deceased relatives and friends, both military and civilian.
