Revelation 21:1-4

INTRODUCTION: Suffering is common to all mankind. Jesus said: John 16:33. Why is there so much suffering in this world? We don't always know why some seem to suffer their whole life long and others only suffer intermittently. But thank God there is coming a day when suffering will be no more!

I. THERE WILL BE NO MORE TEARS!
